

THE HOLY SEASON OF LENT: begins in 2 weeks on Ash Wednesday March 1st. Blessed Ashes will be conferred during the usual 9:00 am Mass, and, at the 5:30 pm Mass.

Ash Wednesdays begins the holy season of Lent when we honor the 40 day fast of Our Lord, Jesus Christ in the desert of Judea, after which HE resisted the temptations of the Evil One. Hence, Lent is the 40 day period of time when we face our own temptations and resist the whims of the Evil One who seeks our separation and the destruction of our souls. That is why Holy Mother the Church advocates our own fast and abstinence so that we might detach from the distractions of the world, and may grow stronger in our understanding, our conviction, and in our love of Our Lord, and HIS holy Church.

This year the theme of Lent will be: Lift up your hearts to the Lord.

THANK YOU: to everyone who has been contributing to the CAPITOL IMPROVEMENT FUND COLLECTION. As a result of your past generosity to the parish, we have been able to make significant single time much needed improvements to the Church edifice and to the parish hall. The next major repair project we are facing, and for which we are saving up, is the repaving of the Church parking lot which is in dire need. Patched jobs and filling in the gaps are no longer an option. Hopefully, we will be able to complete this project by the end of the summer. The work will entail ripping up the existing asphalt, milling the ground and eliminating major uneven surfaces, and repaving and restriping the new surface.

BIRTHRIGHT: is an emergency pregnancy service offering free pregnancy tests, friendship counseling, and practical support. Our guiding principle: it is the right of every pregnant woman to give birth and the right of every child to be born. Birthright has served in Connecticut since 1972 and has ten locations. We help any pregnant girl or woman who calls us with friendship counseling, and with clerical and clothing work. There are 10 locations in CT.

CAMP VERITAS 2017: Camp Veritas is a one-week play-and-pray sleep summer camp for teens going into 7<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup> grades. It will be held at three USA locations in 2017: 1) July 16-0 22 at Mount St. Mary College in Newburgh, NY; 2) July 23 – 29 at Summit Lake Camp in Emmitsburg, MD; and, 3) August 13 – 19 at Camp Lakota in Wurtsboro, NY. Enrollment is open; the enrollment price for each week is \$450 per camper. Early bird rates (if paid in full by April 1) are \$400 for all sites. St. Polycarp February 23



St. Polycarp [Πολύκαρπος, *Polýkarpos*] meaning 'very fruitful,' a Syrian, born in 69 AD was consecrated Bishop of Smyrna, Turkey during the 2<sup>nd</sup> century. According to Church historians, Irenaeus and Tertullian, Polycarp had been a disciple of St. John the Apostle, who converted him to the Holy Christian Faith, and subsequently ordained him Priest and Bishop of Smyrna. He had conversations with many people who had seen, heard, and witnessed Jesus Christ. He is known as 1 of 3 "Apostolic Fathers," due to direct affinity to the Holy Apostles of Our Lord.

Irenaeus wrote to Florinus: "I could tell you the place where the blessed Polycarp sat to preach the Word of God. It is yet present to my mind with what gravity he everywhere came in and went out; what was the sanctity of his deportment, the majesty of his countenance; and what were his holy exhortations to the people. I seem to hear him now relate how he conversed with John and many others who had seen Jesus Christ, the words he had heard from their mouths.

Hence, it is believed that St. John converted him to Christianity as a very young man or even a boy, and that He professed Christ for 86 years.

St. Polycarp visited Pope Anicetus, Bishop of Rome, during 150-160 AD, to discuss issues, especially, the celebration of Easter, which Polycarp insisted on the  $14^{th}$  of the Hebrew month of Nisan-the original day of the Resurrection of Our Lord from the Dead, while Pope Anicetus prevailed with the Western Church's custom of celebrating Easter on the  $1^{st}$  Sunday after the first full moon following the *Invernal Equinox* (March 21).

According to the *Martyrdom of Polycarp*, the Saint's death is Saturday, February 23, 156, A.D. He is recorded as having said: "Eighty and six years I have served HIM, and HE has done me no wrong. How can I blaspheme my King and Saviour? You threaten me with a fire that burns for a season, and after a little while is quenched; but you are ignorant of the fire of everlasting punishment that is prepared for the wicked."

St. Polycarp was burned at the stake, however, when the flames refuse to touch his body, he was pierced with a lance/spear for refusing to burn incense to the Roman Emperor. On his farewell, he said: "I bless you Father for judging me worthy of this hour, so that in the company of the Holy Martyrs I may share the Chalice of Christ."
