

#### FROM THE PASTOR:

ADULT CATHOLIC EDCUATION: the next classes will be conducted next Sunday March  $26^{th}$  between the hours of 9:45-10:40. Anyone and everyone wishing to enhance their understanding of our Holy Faith are welcome, and are invited to join us at the 11:00 am Mass following class.

THE HOLY SEASON OF LENT: During this 40 day solemn Season of Lent, we are reminded in the Book of Exodus that human nature, lacking Faith, grumbles against what it does not understand, and so the Israelites complained against Moses and against GOD, in their thirst for lack of water. Bible teaches that GOD can do the impossible, as in this account HE heard their grumbling and caused water to pour forth from a rock at Mount Horeb. Moses called this place: "Massah" and "Meribah"-both Hebrew for: "quarrel" and "strife" respectively, for it appears that they lacked hope. In his Epistle to the Romans, Paul of Tarshish remind them that hope does not disappoint because we have been justified by faith through the holocaust of Our Lord, Jesus Christ. It is this Christ, the Messiah-Anointed of the Lord-Who restored hope to the Samaritan woman who was astonished that He should ask her for a drink of water. When He opened the eyes of her understanding as to Who He is, she left the purpose for her trek there and ran off to announce that she had found the Messiah. It is only through our profession of Jesus Christ as the Son of GOD, Our Saviour, that we have Eternal Salvation.

The theme for Lent this year will be: Lift up your hearts to the Lord.

Loaves and Fishes envelopes to help feed the poor will be available in a basket throughout these 40 days of fast and abstinence.

### \*\*\*\*\*\* FRIDAYS DURING LENT AND ESP., GOOD FRIDAY ARE SOLEMN DAYS OF FAST & ABSTINENCE\*\*\*\*\*\*

ABSTINENCE: ALL Catholics are bound & required to abstain from ALL meat & poultry products on Fridays during Lent, and of course on Good Friday.

FASTING: All Catholic 14 – 59 years of age are bound to fast barring the ill. Fasting refers to the consuming of only one normal full meal & 2 small meals which are MEATLESS. Together, these 2 meals should not equal one full meal. Water, liquid medicines, and pill form medicines are ALWAYS permitted; expectant & nursing mothers may be exempted.

FRIDAYS: during the season of Lent are days of abstinence from all meat products and luxuriant indulgence. Remember that Our Lord Jesus Christ died on a Friday. Early Christians resonated the proclamation of St. John the Baptist who decreed that Jesus Christ is "The Lamb of God, Who takes away the sins of the world," and therefore no further blood should be shed nor any meat consumed as a sign of our mourning, penance, and spiritual discipline. Recall also that every Wednesday during Lent recalls "Spy Wednesday" when Our Saviour was betrayed by one of His own Apostles—Judas Iscariot. Accordingly, on this day we commemorate & lament the arrangement of the betrayal of Our Lord.

LENTEN CONFESSIONS: will be heard every Tuesday evening during Lent from 7:00 – 8:00 pm. STATION OF THE CROSS: will be conducted every Friday evening at 7:00 pm, followed by Benediction.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS AND BENEDICTION: the Connecticut State Council of the Knights of Columbus invites everyone to participate in the Devotion of the Stations of the Cross followed by Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and Benediction, on Palm Sunday, April 9<sup>th</sup> at 2:00 pm at St. Margaret Shrine, 2523 Park Avenue in Bridgeport. The Main Celebrant will be Bishop Caggiano assisted by Msgr. J. Peter Cullen, State Chaplain.

St. Joseph, Husband of Mary March 19



"Joseph" 757'- Hebrew renders: "GOD will add."
St. Joseph is mentioned in the Holy Gospels of St.
Matthew and St. Luke as the foster father of the Son of
GOD-Our Lord Jesus Christ. Although very little is known
about his background, early Christians living in Jerusalem
and its environs maintained the Holy Tradition that St.
Joseph was a widower who had sired 7 children in his first
marriage. After his first wife had died, he remained
celibate and worked as a tradesman-a carpenter-who lived
in Nazareth.

Accordingly, when the time came for the presentation of the child Mary at the Temple of GOD in Jerusalem, a miraculous event occurred through which the High Priests understood that she was to be not only dedicated to GOD, but, she was to be reared in the Temple Cult. When the time came for her arranged marriage, no young man was found suitable, so the High Priest declared that every unmarried man, single or widowed should present himself at the Temple. In compliance, St. Joseph already an older widower came with his walking staff. When he was presented before the High Priest, his staff was transmuted into a lily stalk-which is why he is always portrayed holding a lily with one arm and the Holy Child on the other. The High Priest interpreted this as a sign from GOD that: Joseph was chosen from on HIGH to be the suitable husband for the young maiden Mary-who was later found with child before the affianced couple lived together.

St. Joseph is described as a holy and just man who was befuddled. He reached the decision to divorce the expectant maiden quietly when in a dream, he was instructed by the Angel Gabriel to continue the engagement into marriage, as GOD had ordained.

He is not mentioned in the public life of Our Lord, which gives rise to the belief that he may have died before. Additionally, by Jewish Law, Our Lord would not have entrusted the care of His Blessed Mother to St. John, had St. Joseph been alive. Hence the belief he had died earlier.
